

BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT PLAN

Community Living Fort Frances and District is an agency funded by the Ministry of Community and Social Services. Our agency is regulated by the Quality Assurance Measures under Ontario Regulation 299/10 made under the Service and Supports to Promote Social Inclusion of Persons with a Developmental Disability Act, 2008. Regulations state that Behaviour Support Plans must be in place if the person exhibits challenging behaviours. The regulations also stipulate that:

- Behavioural Assessment is used to identify the challenging behaviour, which is defined as behaviour that is aggressive or injurious to oneself or to others or that causes property damage or both and that limits the ability of the person with a developmental disability to participate in daily life activities or in the community and/or to learn new skills. The challenging behaviour is defined, observable and measurable.
- The risks and benefits of various interventions and strategies are considered and the least intrusive and most effective strategies are used. If intrusive measures are considered, collaboration will occur with a psychologist, a psychological associate, a physician, a psychiatrist or a certified behaviour analyst and will be reviewed twice a year by the planning team which includes at least one of these medical or behavioural experts.
- The Behaviour Support Plan is monitored for effectiveness
- The Behaviour Support Plan is approved and reviewed as recommended by the rights committee, where the behaviour includes intrusive behaviour intervention strategies. Example: PRN medication administration, restraint usage or confinement.

Ongoing Data Collection:

If the person displays challenging behaviours which are harmful to themselves or others, and that may or may not involve property damage an incident report is required.

Plan for Reducing/Removing Behavioural Supports (including PRN medication)

Evaluation:

At a minimum the Behaviour Support Plan will be reviewed every six months by the support team. In addition, if the Behaviour Support Plan includes intrusive behaviour measures the Rights Committee will review the plan after the first year of use, and thereafter as recommended by the Rights Committee.
